Judge Jeanne E. Scott Scholarship

Award

One \$2,000 scholarship will be awarded in 2025. This scholarship is nonrenewable and funded by the Central Illinois Women's Bar Association (CIWBA) and the Sangamon County Bar Association (SCBA). This is a discretionary monetary award to be used for school expenses.

Application Process

- 1. Fill out the entire enclosed application form.
- 2. Write an essay, of a maximum of two (2) pages in length, on one of the provided prompts. The essay must be typewritten in 12-point Times New Roman font and double-spaced with one-inch margins. Include your name in the upper right-hand margin.
- 3. Obtain two letters of recommendation. Only one may be from a professor, counselor, or administrator. Neither may be from a relative. All letters must indicate the full name of the candidate being recommended. Applicants should fill out the information for the two recommenders asked to write letters in the space provided on the enclosed form. The recommenders shall email their letters directly to the CIWBA.
- 4. Provide your most recent school transcript. A certified copy is not required.
- 5. Submit your application packet by <u>March 31, 2025</u>, via email to <u>ciwba@ciwba.org</u> with the subject line: "CIWBA Scholarship".

Eligibility

- 1. To apply, you must be:
 - a. A student enrolled in an accredited two- or four-year college or university in the spring semester of 2025, intending to go to law school; OR
 - b. A graduate of a two- or four-year college or university applying to attend an accredited law school, or set to attend an accredited law school in the fall semester of 2025; OR
 - c. A student enrolled in an accredited law school in the spring semester of 2025.
- 2. To apply, you must have been a resident of one of the following Illinois counties when you graduated high school:
 - Adams, Brown, Calhoun, Cass, Champaign, Christian, Clark, Coles, Cumberland, DeWitt, Douglas, Edgar, Ford, Fulton, Greene, Hancock, Iroquois, Jersey, Livingston, Logan, Macon, Macoupin, Mason, McDonough, McLean, Menard, Montgomery,

Morgan, Moultrie, Peoria, Piatt, Pike, Sangamon, Schuyler, Scott, Shelby, Tazewell, Vermilion, or Woodford.

Judging

The CIWBA Scholarship Committee will consider the application materials of all applicants. The award will be based upon the written essay, school transcript, school and community activities, and letters of recommendation. The recipient will be an individual with involvement in their community, interest in and commitment to the law, and an interest in becoming an active participant in the Central Illinois legal community.
